Today, Brittany Ferries is not only the leading ferry operator on the Western Channel but also renowned for an extensive choice of hotel and self-catering holidays in France and Spain. FERRIES OF DENMARK Bruce Peter

Text in English & Danish. Denmark is a nation of islands approximately five hundred in total, of which around a fifth are inhabited. This new photographic album consists of over two hundred recently taken landscape photographs showing ferries all around Denmark's coasts, fjords, peninsulas and offshore islands. The vessels range from very large overnight cruise ferries to small double-ended craft, maintaining routes of only a few minutes duration.

AUTHOR INFORMATION: Bruce Peter is a graduate of the Glasgow School of Art, the Royal College of Art and of the University of Glasgow. He works as an architecture and design historian in the GSA's Department of Historical & Critical Studies, where he lectures on a broad range of subjects, relating mainly to Twentieth Century design history and theory. His research interests address the Modern Movement in architecture and design and its relationship with popular culture, mass leisure, entertainment, travel and transport environments. Additionally, Bruce is a design journalist and critic, writing for publications in the UK, Denmark and Sweden.



HURTIGRUTEN 120 John Bryant

Since its inception in 1893, the Hurtigruten continues to fascinate and attract travellers from all over the world, sailing along a coastline which has no equal, with over half of the journey north of the Arctic Circle. It is an intriguing tale about a unique transport artery which has a mission and a duty extending far beyond tourism, the Hurtigruten being an integral part of the coastal community from which it gains its livelihood. Lavishly illustrated it draws together all the threads from the past 120 years and more which make the Hurtigruten what it is today, with its core business still to provide a daily lifeline for the 34 communities served along its 1,352 nautical mile route between Bergen and Kirkenes, albeit with modern purpose built ships to cruise liner standards.

RAMSEY STEAMSHIP CO. 1913- 2013 Stan Basnett

This book celebrates the centenary of the Ramsey Steamship Co. Ltd. It is a short history in words and pictures illustrating its highlights and some of its difficult times. By way of a tribute to the longevity of this island-based company, having achieved one hundred years of operation, this book traces its development from 1913 to the present day, predominately using photographs that give an insight into the different aspects of running a small shipping company. It charts the progress of a proud Manx company that is now among one of the very few early coastal tramp steamship companies to have survived into the 21st century albeit trading further afield than the British Isles. During its lifetime it has owned and operated just twenty-six ships.
